1. Are your house numbers 4 to 6 inches high and visible from the street both during the day and night?
2. Is your mailbox clearly marked with your address?
3. Does your mailbox have a lock to protect your mail?
4. Are shrubs, bushes and other plants within 4 feet of a sidewalk, driveway, door or gate maintained at a height of 2 feet or less?
5. Are shrubs, bushes and other plants within 8 feet of a sidewalk, driveway, door or gate maintained at a height of 4 feet or less?
6. Are tree branches at least 6 feet above the ground?
7. Are trees located or pruned such that they cannot be used to climb to an upper level of the home?
8. Do you use thorny/spiny plants as ground cover along fences and under windows?
9. Has decorative rock or material that makes noise when walked on been used as ground cover near the home?
10. Has fencing, paving, landscaping or other means been used to identify when a person moves from concealment?

Public or common property to your property?

1. If there is a fence around your property are the gates locked?
2. Are bicycles, tools, ladders, etc. secured when not in use?
3. Are detached buildings kept locked?
4. Are vehicles parked on the street or in the driveway locked and are valuables removed or secured in the trunk?
5. Are boats, trailers, 4 wheelers, etc. secured?
6. Are trolling motors, depth finders, etc. removed or secured?
7. Are exterior phone lines protected so they cannot be easily cut?
8. Are exterior utility boxes secured to prevent unauthorized access?
9. Do exterior lights provide 360-degree lighting around the perimeter of your residence?
10. Are your lights controlled by photocells or motion sensors instead of a manual switch?
11. Are entryways, porches and walkways to the residence illuminated at night?
12. Are low mounted lights protected so the bulbs cannot be unscrewed?
13. Are all the exterior lights working?

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## Garage

1. Is the garage door kept closed when not in use, even when home?
2. If not equipped with a garage door opener, is the door kept locked?
3. Are keys removed from vehicles parked in the driveway or garage?
4. Are windows covered with shades or tinting to prevent persons from looking in to assess what valuables are stored in the garage?
5. Is a keypad used for entry into garage?
6. Is the code periodically changed?
7. Are doors from the garage into the house kept locked?
8. Are there deadbolts on the exterior and interior garage doors?

## Doors

1. Are exterior doors leading into the house and garage metal or solid core construction?
2. Do doors fit properly in their frames?
3. Are all exterior perimeter doors "hardened"?
4. Is your "Safe Room" door hardened?
5. Do exterior doors have a 190-degree wide angle viewer, door scope, camera or window installed?
6. Are door locks at least 40 inches from windows or are double cylinder deadbolt locks installed?
(Check fire codes before installing double cylinder deadbolt locks.)
7. Are exterior door strike plates secured to the door frame with at least 3 inch screws and is the opening "Hardened"?
8. If exterior doors open outward and have exposed hinges are the hinge pins secured in place to prevent easy removal?
9. If your home has sliding glass doors are measures taken to prevent the door from being lifted and removed from its track?
10. Have measures been taken to prevent sliding glass doors from being pried open by installing appropriate auxiliary locks?
11. Are exterior doors kept locked even when someone is at home?

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12. If you have an animal door can it be locked or blocked?
13. Are vents, skylights, crawl spaces etc. secured?

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## Locks

1. Are door locks in good repair?
2. Are keys removed from double cylinder deadbolts?
3. If previously occupied, were the locks rekeyed when you moved in?
4. Are the bolts on exterior and garage door deadbolts at least 1 " deep and do they fully seat into the mortise?
5. Do you know everyone who has a key to your home?
6. Do you have a plan on place to avoid having to "hide" a key outside the house in the event you are locked out?
7. Do you know that anyone can duplicate your key?
8. Do you know that there are affordable restricted keys available?

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## Windows

1. Have secondary locks been installed on all windows that open?
2. Are windows covered with shades or a similar item when no one is home?
3. Are window air conditioning units or those installed in walls, grouted or secured to prevent easy removal?
4. If windows are opened are they secured to prevent the opening from exceeding 6 inches?

1. Do you have security cameras?
2. Are they cloud-based Recording or DVR recordings?
3. Do they produce a good quality recording?
4. Are they properly placed and adjusted?
5. Are they reliable and weather resistant?

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## Interior

1. Have items of value been engraved with your Florida DL or ID number to help identify your property if it's stolen?
2. Have you recorded the make, model and serial number of items which have them?
3. Have you video taped or photographed valuable items without serial numbers or which cannot be engraved?

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4. Do you have an inventory of all your valuable items?
5. Have you removed name/address from your key ring in case it is lost or stolen?
6. Do you store your valuable papers in a safe or safety deposit box?
7. If you have a home safe is it secured to the house or sufficiently heavy to prevent easy removal?
8. If you have firearms are they unloaded and safely stored, especially out of the reach of children?
9. Is ammunition secured separately from firearms?
10. Are spare keys to vehicles, house, etc. plainly visible to a guest, repairman or burglar?
11. Are interior lights left on at night when the home is unoccupied?

## Child Safety At Home

1. Are prescription drugs, alcohol, medicines, vitamins, cleaning supplies and other dangerous products properly stored?
2. Have you trained your children on how to handle someone at the door?
3. Have your children been provided with safe statements to say when someone is at the door?
4. Do you have and practice a fire escape plan with children?
5. Do you have smoke and carbon monoxide detectors installed and do they work?
6. Is there responsible adult supervision for children when you are not home?
7. Are 911 and other emergency contact numbers posted by the phone?
8. Have your children been taught about STRANGER DANGER?
9. Do your children know the "Stop, Leave, Tell" rules if they find a firearm?

## Vacation/Away From Home

1. Do you arrange for a trusted friend or neighbor to watch and check your home when you are away?
2. Do you stop mail, paper and package delivery or arrange for a trusted friend or neighbor to pick them up when you are away?
3. Are arrangements made to have garbage cans put out and picked up while you are gone?
4. Are arrangements made to have the lawn mowed while you are away?
5. Do you use timing devices to turn lights on and off while you are away?
6. Is the garage door opener deactivated while you are gone?
7. Do you arrange for a neighbor to park a vehicle in the driveway while you are away?
8. Is the ringer on the phone turned down or off while you are gone?
9. Do you provide emergency contact information for friend or neighbor if they need to contact you while you are away?
10. Do you avoid discussing your vacations and trips away from home with people if there is no reason for them to know?

## Miscellaneous

1. Are documents with personal information shredded before being placed in the recyclable bin or trash?
2. Are birth certificates, Social Security cards, and important papers stored in a safe?
3. Do you retrieve your mail as soon as possible?
4. Have you told your family members not to disturb anything and to call the police if they discover the home has been burglarized?
5. Do you have your house/car key in your hand and ready when coming and going from home?

This checklist is not all encompassing, but is intended to assist you in assessing the security of your home and family.
